GFWC/Iowa recently established an online records page with the Women's History and Resource Center located in GFWC headquarters in Washington D.C. This records page also includes the link to the GFWC/Iowa records in the University of Iowa Archives. GFWC/Iowa is the first state to have recorded and cataloged archives linked to a records page of the Women's History and Resource Center. Calling all GFWC/Iowa Club Historians



I am in search of a movie film that was made by the Iowa Federation of Women's Clubs in the late 1930s. It shows the Iowa artist, Grant Wood, speaking to Iowa Clubwomen. Mr. Wood is telling Mrs. Henry Ness of Ames and Miss Louise Orwig of Des Moines of his dream for Iowa art and of his appreciation of the constant support of the Iowa Federation of Women's Clubs over a long period of years.

The portion of interest to me is a scene from the club sound-movie film, *Partners in Progress*. The article which told of this, from the *Iowa Clubwoman* of March/April 1942, went on to say the copies of the film could be secured by writing, Iowa News Flashes, at 2819 Ingersoll in Des Moines. The buyer was asked to designate 35 or 16 millimeter.

I am hoping that some of these were purchased by clubs and that one might still remain. If you have a copy of the film or information that would be helpful in locating the film, please contact me. This is not available in your University of Iowa Archives and I would appreciate your help in locating the film.

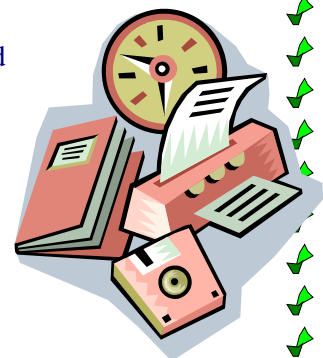

This officer is proud of every report that is sent in and wants to read the great projects that GFWC/Iowa women work so hard to provide for their community and this organization.

Marian St. Clair, GFWC Treasurer gave helpful fundraising hints at the GFWC/Iowa State Convention in April.

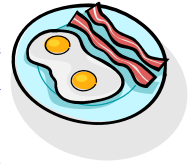
For pecan sales, she suggested baking with the pecans and serving the samples. With a purchase of pecans, the customer would also receive the recipes.

Here is how to get the GFWC 50 year pin and how to be honored at state convention.

Directions to receive the GFWC 50 year pin. The state does not have records for the longevity of individual memberships. The clubs have this information or the member usually knows. The club president or club membership chairman must fill out the GFWC 50 year pin request form and send this completed form to the GFWC headquarters in Washington D.C. The headquarters will send the 50 year pin to the person that requested the pin. The 50 year pin is free to those that have not previously received the 50 year card. 25 year pins are available in the GFWC marketplace for purchase.

Directions to receive a certificate at convention for 50 or 25 year members. The club president or the club membership chairman must notify the state membership chairman of the person(s) that have achieved membership honors. Include the name of the person, the name of the club and the number of years.

Several clubs in GFWC/Iowa were honored with in the *GFWC Clubwoman Magazine* for the "Seasons of Membership" campaign. Clubs that acquire three new members send the completed form to GFWC headquarters in Washington D.C. Please complete the New Members form in the GFWC/Iowa Bluebook and send to GFWC/Iowa headquarters in Des Moines.

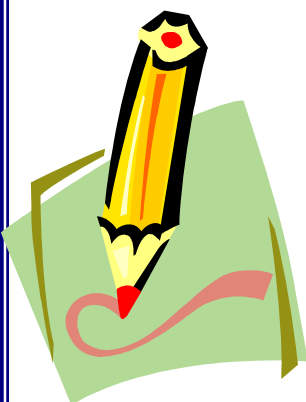

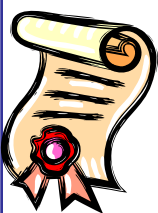

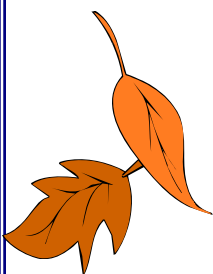
